Foundation Allowance - The Senate proposal increases the FA by \$302/pupil, or 3.1%, which would bring it just under \$10,000/pupil. Early estimates are guessing that will be closer to about \$240 per student increase.

At-Risk Expansion - The Senate adds \$122 million to Sec. 31a bringing the total to over \$1 billion. They also would expand the use of the funds for retention and recruitment of instructional staff and staff providing social/emotional/physical health services.
